Temptation 1: Choosing status over results

Don't worry about public recognition, seek results.

Temptation 2: Choosing popularity over accountability.

Don't water down negative feedback for the sake of friendship. Be honest and seek results.

Temptation 3: Choosing certainty over clarity.

Don't get caught up in unnecessary debates over minutiae. In other words, be wary of the paralysis of analysis.

Temptation 4: Choosing harmony over productive conflict.

Don't focus on harmony, but focus on results. Spirited debate can lead to greater success. Conflict can create an opportunity for re-evaluation, which may lead to a preferred future.

Temptation 5: Choosing invulnerability over trust.

Don't be insecure. Admit when you are wrong. Acknowledge your weaknesses and surround yourself with people who can help you.
